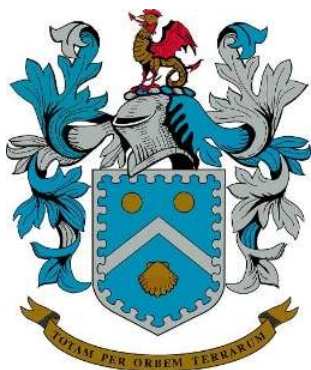


## The South African National Geography Olympiad (SANGO)



## SANGO

The Southern African Geography Teachers' Association (SAGTA) and the Society of South African Geographers (SSAG) ran with the first online South African Geography Olympiad on the **14<sup>th</sup> September 2017**. The long term goal is to represent South Africa at the International Geography Olympiad, called the **GeoOlympiad** (see: <http://www.geoolympiad.org>) from 2020.

The Olympiad was a multiple choice online test, consisting of 40 questions. In total sum 946 learners successfully participated and completed the 2017 SANGO. The results of the 2017 SANGO are as follows:
